We must promote the respect of diversity so that we avoid events occurring in today's hotspots, which contribute to the infecting of young people", said Ivanov, adding the prestigious award recognized Macedonia and its citizens.

This year's laureates also include UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, Bosnia&Herzegovina Presidency chairman Bakir Izetbegovic, former Senegal Prime Minister Aminata Toure, and posthumously to Herve Gourdel.
