## Foreign Minister Brantley leads delegation to Crans Montana Forum in Dakhla, Morocco

Dakhla, Morocco (March 18, 2016) – Hon. Mark A. G. Brantley is currently in Morocco to participate in the Crans Montana Forum held under the high patronage of H.M. The King Mohammed VI of Morocco. This event is in its second edition in Dakhla and organizes international cross-cutting dialogues that lead to the assessment of sustainable development projects. This year's forum is dedicated to Africa, the Regional Cooperation and the Future of the South-South Cooperation.
